Jean Nicolet had an affair with an American Indian of Lake Nipissing: Jeanne Gisis-Bahmahmaadjimiwin (thanks to Lucie Codere for this note of importance.) A daughter was born in 1628 in Quebec of the union: Euphrasie-Madeleine Nicolet (1628-1689). This information is kept in national registers, the marriages on pages 788 and 994. Due to this, a half blood descendant came from this union.

Note by Chris_AQC: Jean Nicolet actually had two children by this woman as documented with citations in my family tree. I had found a birthdate of around 1602 for Jeanne, born in Lac Nipissing, Quebec, Canada; she died in Quebec, the date of death is estimated 1636 in Ville de Quebec, Quebec, Canada.



¹ Jeanne Nipissing (Anishinabae Kweh - Femme Ojibwe) was born about 1600 near Lake Nipissing, Ontario, Canada (National Register of Marriages, pgs. 788-994). She married Jean Nicolet, before 1623 in near Lake Nipissing, Ontario, Canada. He was born about 1595, and died 19 October 1642 in Sillery, Quebec, Canada.

Notes for Nipissing Anishinabae Kweh: Bahmahmaadjimowin Giisis, as some people call her, supposed to have came from the Algonquin Nation (Nipissing), Gichisippirini, (people of

the great river) and was refered to as Jeanne Nipissing.

Bahmahmaadjimowin Giizis in the context of Jean means "The way we are going to work together" daughter of the history story teller or there will be ways to work together, the beginning of a new way, the start of working in a good way. Translated...

Jean Nicolet (Manitouiriniou, nom améerindien de Nicolet, Relations des Jésuites 23, 277-279) a eu une conjointe amérindienne du lac Nipissing: Jeanne Gisis Bahmahmaadjimiwin (merci à ucie Codère pour cette précision d'importance).
