1740: William Whitehouse is one of the men on the "List of ye Second foot Company of Dover, July the 24, 1740." [Source: v9 p174 NH State Papers.]

1741: William Whitehouse is one of the men on the "Counterpin of the Parish List anno Domini 1741 Cocheco Parish." [Source: v24 p700 NH State Papers.]

1749 & 1750: William Whitehouse was one of the owners of shares of land in the new Town of Middleton (adjacent to the Town of Rochester)(formed for the benefit of men from Dover & Somersworth, with three exceptions). Lots were drawn by lot. William's name was drawn 56th and he was awarded Lot 71. [Source: v27 pp 493-499 NH State Papers.][Note: Middletown was first settled shortly before the Revolutionary War by settlers from Lee and Rochester. Middleton was incorporated on March 4, 1778, and originally included Brookfield, which was split off in December 1794.]

The following Deed could have been granted to either William Whitehouse sr or William Whitehouse junr:

1764: Deed. Grantor: Daniel Heard of Dover, yeoman. Grantee: William Whitehouse of Dover, yeoman. Payment: 440 pounds old tenor. Property: a parcel in the 2nd division of the Town of Rochester, containing 60 acres, being part of one right originally granted to Ephraim Wentworth of Dover deceased as part of a 180 acre tract which Ephraim gave to his son Jonathan Wentworth of Dover deceased and the 60 acre tract was conveyed to my hon. Father Saml Heard junior of Dover which he gave me in his Will. Warranties. Dated 10 March 1764. Signed Daniel Heard his mark X. Witnesses Ephm Hanson & Francis Drew junr. [Rockingham County Deed Book 89, page 178.]

1770: William Whitehouse by this year had improved his Lot #71 in Middleton by building a house. [Source: Middleton Improvement List, v27 p511,512 NH State Papers.]

1784: Unsourced family trees state that William Whitehouse died in 1784.
