

Alpaïda

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Alpaïda (also **Alphaïda**, **Alpoïde**, **Elphide**, **Elfide**, **Chalpaïda**; ca. 654 – ca. 714) was a noblewoman of the House of Pepin, who hailed from the Liège area.^{[1][2]} The daughter of Alberic of Austrasia and Adèle of Poitiers, she was Pepin II's (635 or 640 – December 16, 714) second wife and mother to two sons, Charles Martel (Charles the Hammer) (d. October 22, 741) and Childebrand (678–751).^[3]
