Ermengarde of Hesbaye

Ermengarde (or **Irmingard**) of <u>Hesbaye</u> (c. 778 – 3 October 818), probably a member of the <u>Robertian</u> dynasty, was <u>Holy Roman Empress</u> from 813 and <u>Queen of the Franks</u> from 814 until her death as the wife of the <u>Carolingian</u> emperor Louis the Pious.

Life

Ermengarde was the daughter of Count Ingerman of Hesbaye and Rotrude.

About 794 Ermengarde married <u>Louis the Pious</u>, [1] son of <u>Charlemagne</u>, who since 781 ruled as a King of <u>Aquitaine</u>. He had already fathered two children, and Ermengarde may have been his <u>concubine</u>. Ermengarde gave birth to six children:

- Lothair I (795–855),^[1] born in Altdorf, Bavaria
- Pepin I of Aquitaine (797–838)^[1]
- Adelaide, born ca. 799
- Rotrude, born about 800,^[1] married Gerard, Count of Auvergne (c. 800 d. 25.6.841) Comte de Auvergne and they had Ranulf I of Poitiers.
- Hildegard/Matilda, born c.802,^[1] abbess of Notre-Dame in Laon
- Louis the German (c.805–876),^[1] King of East Francia

Charlemagne initially intended to divide his <u>Carolingian Empire</u> between Louis and his brothers <u>Pepin</u> and <u>Charles</u>, who nevertheless died in quick succession in 810/11. On 10 September 813, Charlemagne designated Louis his successor and had him proclaimed co-emperor. Ermengarde's husband became sole ruler as <u>Holy Roman Emperor</u> and <u>King of the Franks</u> upon his father's death on 28 January 814. The couple was anointed and crowned Emperor and Empress by <u>Pope Stephen IV</u> on 5 October 816 in <u>Reims Cathedral</u>. [2]

She died at <u>Angers</u>, <u>Neustria</u> (in present-day <u>France</u>) on 3 October 818.^[3] A few years after her death, her husband remarried to <u>Judith of Bavaria</u>, who bore him Charles the Bald.^[3]
