Matilda married Conrad of Burgundy in 964.^[1] As her dowry, the young Queen brought her husband the city of Vienne, which her brother Lothar had ceded to her.^[2]

- Bertha of Burgundy (967 16 January 1016), married Robert II of France^[1]
- Matilda of Burgundy (born 969), possibly married Robert, Count of Geneva
- Rudolph III of Burgundy (971 6 September 1032)^[1]




